NEWS OF OTHER HISTORICAL SOCIETIES

ESQUATAK - ON FEBRUARY 17TH, THE SOCIETY WILL HOST A SPECIAL SLIDE AND LECTURE PROGRAM ON THE HISTORY OF THE STAATS HOUSE AND FARM ON PAPSCANEE ISLAND AND THE OLD FARMS AND HOUSES ON THE RIVER ROAD BELOW THE RENSSELAER CITY LINE. MEMBERS OF ESQUATAK'S SURVEY GROUP AND ARCHITECTURE COMMITTEE HAVE BEEN STUDYING THE HOUSES AND HISTORY OF THE AREA BACK TO THE 1600'S. MEETING LOCATION WILL BE ANNOUNCED.

RENSSELAER COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY - CONDUCTING A FUND RAISING DRIVE AIMEL AT THE RENOVATION AND ENDOWMENT OF THE ADJACENT BUILDING AT 57 SECOND STREET, PURCHASED ABOUT A YEAR AGO. IN THAT BUILDING, THE SOCIETY IS PLANNING TO SET ASIDE A ROOM ESPECIALLY FOR THE USE OF HISTORICAL SOCIETIES IN THE COUNTY. HISTORIC NOTES

FROM THE RENSSELAER COUNTY DIRECTORY OF 1870-71 - SAND LAVE FOLKS DID NOT HAVE TO LEAVE THE AREA TO LOOK FOR WORK. THE GAZETEER, PUB-LISHED BY HAMILTON CHILD, LISTS MANY BUSINESSES IN THE TOWN OF SAND LAKE. THE TROY & NEW ENGLAND RAILWAY PROVIDED JOBS AS WELL AS TRANS-PORTATION BETWEEN TROY AND AVERILL PARK. THERE WAS A WOOLEN MILL, OWNED BY JAMES AKEN, AND KNIT GOOPS WERE MANUFACTURED BY KNOWLSON & KIDDER AND O. B. ARNOLD. COTTON WARPS, USED IN WEAVING, WERE MAPE BY THE S. L. WARP CO., AND MERWIN & CO. OWNED A PAPER MILL. THERE WAS A CARRIAGE SHOP AT SLITER'S CORNERS AS WELL AS NUMEROUS STORES AND HOTELS IN THE AREA. THERE WAS CHARCOAL BURNING, AND TANBARK USED IN THE TANNING OF HIPES, BOTH SOLD IN TROY AND ALBANY.

JOHNSON AND THE SCHUYLER FAMILY; THE INCIDENTS LEADING UP TO THE REVOLUTION, THE STORY OF JANE MCCREA, THE TORY CONSPIRACIES; ALSO AN ACCOUNT OF THE BURNING OF BALLSTON SPA AND THE BATTLE FOR SARATOGA. ALSO INCLUDED ARE THE ORIGINS OF THE TOWNS AND SETTLEMENTS, AND THE TOPOGRAPHY OF THE COUNTY.
