TOWN PURCHASES HISTORIC GLASSMAKING TOOLS

IN OCTOBER, THE TOWN PURCHASED A SET OF EARLY GLASSMAKING TOOLS. THESE TOOLS ARE THE SAME TYPE USED BY GLASSWORKERS IN OUR OWN RENSSELAER GLASS FACTORY AT GLASS LAKE. THEY WERE HANDMADE BY GLASSWORKERS AND WERE USED IN THE MT. WASHINGTON GLASS FACTORY IN NEW BEDFORD, MASS. DURING THE SAME PERIOD THAT THE RENSSELAER GLASS FACTORY WAS IN OPERATION. (1805-1852)

THESE TOOLS ARE A RARE HISTORIC FIND, AND WILL BE INVALUABLE IN TEACHING THE SCHOOLCHILDREN ABOUT GLASSMAKING AS A PART OF LOCAL HISTORY.

THE TOOLS WERE SHOWN IN THE GLASS EXHIBIT DURING HOUSE TOUR '81, AND ARE NOW ON EXHIBIT AT THE TOWN HALL. STOP IN AND SEE THEM.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: On the Allocation of Resources OR Get a Little Charge at your SLHS!

DURING THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS IT HAS BEEN MY OBSERVATION THAT THE MOST SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS OF THE SOCIETY HAVE BEEN THOSE IN WHICH THE PEOPLE INVOLVED HAD FUN EVEN THOUGH THEY WERE WORKING HARD. I AM CONVINCED THAT THIS IS A VITAL ELEMENT TO THE SUCCESS OF A VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION. PROJECTS MUST MEET SOME NEED OF THE WORKERS AND SHOULD ALSO MEET NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY TO BE REALLY SUCCESSFUL. WE HAVE TO GET A LITTLE CHARGE OUT OF WHAT WE DO.

People do not long support groups just because they exist. The group must meet some needs of people. Our group is small; our personal resources are limited; and this limits the size and number of projects we can undertake. The society can be successful as a small group. Should we wish to grow, we must provide a little charge to a broader base of the community.

FINANCIALLY WE HAVE GROWN SEVERAL HUNDRED DOLLARS OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS THANKS TO DUES, DONATIONS, AND SEVERAL FUND RAISERS AS WELL AS COST CONTROL. FINANCIAL GROWTH IS IMPORTANT FOR SEVERAL REASONS, INCLUDING THE PROBABLE CONTINUED SCARCITY OF PUBLIC MONEY. WE SHOULD PROBABLY CONTINUE TO SEEK AN INCOME TO BLIGHTLY MORE THAN OFFSET EVERY EXPENSE. WE HAVE PUT OUT GOOD PRODUCTS AND GOOD SERVICES, AND WE HAVE ASKED PEOPLE TO PAY A LITTLE CHARGE FOR THEM.

OUR FUTURE ACTIVITIES SHOULD BE SUCCESSFUL IF THEY ALLOW US TO GET A LITTLE CHARGE, GIVE A LITTLE CHARGE, AND ASK A LITTLE CHARGE.

CHESTER ALAN ARTHUR BECAME THE 21ST PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES (1861-1865) UPON THE DEATH OF PRESIDENT JAMES A. GARFIELD ON THE 19TH OF SEPTEMBER, 1881, AS A RESULT OF AN ASSASSIN'S BULLET.

PRESIDENT ARTHUR WAS AN 1848 GRADUATE OF UNION COLLEGE. HE SERVED ONE TERM AS PRESIDENT, AND DIED ON NOVEMBER 18, 1886. HE IS BURIED IN ALBANY RURAL CEMETERY.

1981 HOUSE TOUR A GREAT SUCCESS

HOUSE TOUR '81 WAS HELD ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 4, 1981, FROM 1 TO 5 PM IN THE SAND LAKE—AVERILL PARK AREA, WITH HEADQUARTERS AT THE SAND LAKE TOWN HALL. FEATURED WERE SIX HOMES, THE SAND LAKE BAPTIST CHURCH, THE COUNTRY TOKEN STORE (FORMERLY NASH'S STORE AND THE SAND LAKE POST OFFICE), AS WELL AS SITES OF THE RENSSELAER GLASS FACTORY, JOHN COONS' SAWMILL, STAATS TOMPKINS' PAPER MILL, THE BURDEN DAM AND THE FORMER DEPOT OF THE TROY & NEW ENGLAND RAILWAY (NOW TREMONT'S LUMBER CO.), ALL FROM THE PERIOD 1790-1900.

AT THE TOWN HALL WE HAD TWO AUDIO-VISUAL PROGRAMS, ONE ON THE RENSSELAER GLASS FACTORY AND ANOTHER ON OUR EARLY MILLS. WE HAD EXHIBITS OF RENSSELAER BRAND GLASS AND GLASSMAKING TOOLS; ALSO TOOLS, PRODUCTS AND MEMORABILIA FROM SOME OF THE FARMS AND MILLS. WE ALSO SOLD SOME OF OUR HISTORICAL PUBLICATIONS.

THE TICKETS WERE PRICED AT \$2.00 PER PERSON, AND INCLUDED A PRINTED TOUR BOOKLET AND REFRESHMENTS WHICH WERE SERVED AT THE TOWN HALL ALL AFTERNOON.

EVERYONE WORKED VERY HARD ON THE TOUR; THE OWNERS OF HOMES AND BLDGS., THE TOUR COMMITTEE AND MANY MORE HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEMBERS. A VOTE OF THANKS TO EACH AND EVERY ONE WHO HELPED MAKE THIS TOUR SUCH A GRAND SUCCESS, NOT FORGETTING ALL THOSE GALS WHO BAKED SO MANY DELICIOUS COOKIES FOR THE REFRESHMENT TABLE.
