ABOUT THE HUDSON-MOHAWK GATEWAY -- THE BOOK

THE HUDSON-MOHAWK GATEWAY, AN ILLUSTRATED HISTORY BY FATHER THOMAS PHELAN, IS A WELL-WRITTEN, HANDSOMELY ILLUSTRATED VOLUME WHICH TELLS THE DRAMATIC STORY OF THE FIVE GATEWAY MUNICIPALITIES, TROY, COHOES, WATERFORD, GREEN ISLAND AND WATERVLIET.

AUTHOR PHELAN, TOGETHER WITH CONTRIBUTORS ROBERT G. WAITE, DIANA S. WAITE AND LOIS M. FEISTER, REVEALS THE REGION'S FASCINATING HISTORY.

THERE ARE MORE THAN 200 SUPERB ILLUSTRATIONS, BELECTED BY PICTURE RESEARCHER PETER D. SHAVER, WHO WAS IN CHARGE OF HISTORIC PHOTOS AT THE NEW YORK STATE MUSEUM BETWEEN 1979 AND 1983.
