11 TH ANNUAL DINNER MEETING AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS HELD AT THE SALEM UNITED METHODIST CHURCH IN WEST SAND LAKE. DINNER SPEAKER WAS REV. THOMAS PHELAN, DEAN OF HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCE AT RPI, AND AUTHOR OF "THE HUDSON-MOHAWK GATEWAY," AN ILLUSTRATED HISTORY OF TROY, WATERFORD, COHCES, GREEN ISLAND AND WATERVLIET, PUBLISHED IN 1985.

THE SECOND DECADE CONTINUED THE SAND LAKE HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S GOALS OF VARIED AND INTERESTING PROGRAMS, PLANNED AND PRESENTED BY OUR ABLE VICE PRESIDENT, ALAN FUESS, FEATURING AREA TALENTS AND COLLECTORS.

BESIDE FOCUSING ON LOCAL HISTORY AND VARIOUS ASPECTS OF PRESER-VATION AND RESTORATION, WE CONTINUE TO LOOK TOWARD THE FUTURE BY ENCOURAGING THE YOUTH OF OUR TOWN BY THE INVITATION TO SHOW THEIR STUDENT-PRODUCED VIDEO ON TOWN GOVERNMENT AT A MEETING, AND BY AWARDING TWO SCHOLARSHIPS TO GRADUATING SENIORS AT AVERILL PARK HIGH SCHOOL WHO EXCEL IN HISTORY. IN JUNE 1985, THE SCHOLARSHIPS CONSISTED OF A CHECK FOR \$100 EACH TO VIRGINIA BOURDEAU, DAUGHTER OF MR. AND MRS. JOSEPH BOURDEAU OF GLASS LAKE, AND MARK HILL, SON OF MR. AND MRS. FREDERICK HILL OF SAND LAKE.

ALTHOUGH RISING COSTS OF INSURANCE AND OPERATING SUPPLIES HAVE PROMPTED THE INCREASE OF MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR THE COMING YEAR, OUR MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPATION CONTINUE HEALTHY. IN THIS CONNECTION I ACKNOWLEDGE OUR MEMBERSHIP CHAIRPERSON, ELINOR ZAKI, FOR HER EFFORTS TO UPDATE LISTINGS AND ENCOURAGE CONTINUED PARTICIPATION BY FORMER MEMBERS WHO MAY HAVE BEEN LAX IN THE CONTINUITY OF THEIR FINANCIAL SUPPORT.

BECAUSE OF THE ILLNESS OF OUR TREASURER, THE REQUIRED ANNUAL FINAN-CIAL STATEMENT WILL BE FILED AT A LATER DATE. HOWEVER, FINANCES ARE SOUND, LONG RANGE SPECIAL PROJECT FUND INVESTMENTS HAVING BEEN REVIEWED TO INSURE MAXIMUM RETURNS.

WE REGRETFULLY ACCEPTED THE RESIGNATION OF MYRA WEHNAU, WHO SERVED LONG AND FAITHFULLY AS OUR LIBRARIAN. BARBARA MOHAN WILL BE AN ABLE REPLACEMENT. SHE IS CURRENTLY REORGANIZING AND UPDATING LISTINGS. SHE WILL BE AFFIXING OUR BOOKPLATES, DESIGNED BY OUR OWN PAT BROCK, IN EACH VOLUME IN A NEW PROJECT THIS YEAR TO IDENTIFY AND PROMOTE THE SOCIETY'S RESOURCES AND SERVICES TO ITS MEMBERS.

THERE WERE SEVERAL INNOVATIONS IN PROGRAMMING THIS YEAR. ONE WAS "INSIDE TOWN HALL", A VIDEO PROJECT PRODUCED AND PRESENTED BY 6TH GRADE STUDENTS OF THE EXTENDED TASK GROUP OF SAND LAKE SCHOOL. THE OTHER TOOK THE FORM OF A MINI HOUSE TOUR, PRESENTED AS A SPECIAL PRIVILEGE TO MEMBERS ONLY. OTHER THAN THIS ONE OCCASION, WE CONTINUE COOPERATION WITH AND PROMOTION OF NEIGHBORING HISTORICAL SOCIETIES, AND OUR "OPEN DOOR" POLICY OF WELCOMING ALL INTERESTED COMMUNITY FOLKS TO OUR MEETINGS TO ENJOY THE FORMAL PROGRAMS ANS THE REFRESHMENTS AND SOCIABILITY WHICH FOLLOW.

OUR HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE, CHAIRED BY ADA MILLER, AND ASSISTED BY RUTHEA BACKER, HAS OFFERED DELICIOUS REFRESHMENTS, PRESENTED WITH ORIGINAL DECORATIONS APROPOS OF THE TOPIC OF THE EVENING AND THE SEASON OF THE YEAR.

NOT TO BE OVERLOOKED IS THE SOCIETY'S PURCHASE OF AUTHENTIC TO THE TOWN RENSSELAER GLASS FACTORY ARTICLES WHICH WERE PRESENTED TO THE TOWN OF SAND LAKE WHERE THEY CAN BE PRESERVED AND DISPLAYED AS PERMANENT EVIDENCE OF OUR COMMUNITY'S HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL PAST.

ALL OF THESE ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN THE 1985-86 YEAR COULD HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED ONLY WITH THE FULL AND HARMONIOUS COOPERATION OF YOUR ABLE OFFICERS, TRUSTEES AND COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSONS. 
