

WHAT: Hudson River Charter cruise on the tourboat, "Uncle Sam 111"
(This is a 48 passenger Thousand Island Tourboat)

WHERE: Starting point - Trojan Marina between 109th and 110th
Streets, Lansingburgh.
Tours the riverfront that was the heart of the area's 19th
century development, EITHER -

- upriver, from Waterford to North Troy, passing through
Lock #1 of the State Barge Canal at the Troy dam, on up
to Mechanicville. OR -

- downriver, through the Federal Lock to the Menands Lock
and back.

This tour will have a guide who will describe the historic
and archeological structures and sites along both sides of
the Hudson River. Usually the Captain is the guide down-
river; the Gateway will supply a guide if we decide on
upriver.

WEATHER: Rain or shine (unless it has been raining for a period of
time and the river is choppy - this is a covered boat.)

WHEN: July 18, Sunday, 1:00 P.M. 1976

WHY: Educational and fun!

COST: To charter the tourboat - \$250.00 for 48 people. Your cost,
\$5.00 per person.
